Jointly organized by the Hong Kong Climate Change Forum and The Climate Group, the conference will bring together leading experts from a wide range of disciplines to discuss the impact realities of climate change. Some of the key issues to be addressed at the conference include:

These essential components provide a snapshot of China's reform and development strategy in integrating considerations on sustainability and climate change.
